A distinguished writer and dedicated scholar, Dr. Brown is the author of Amateur Hour: Presidential Character and the Question of Leadership (Routledge, 2020) and Jockeying for the American Presidency: The Political Opportunism of Aspirants (Cambria Press, 2010).

Dr. Brown has written op-eds and blogs for The New York Times, The Washington Post, Politico, The Hill, U.S. News and World Report, The Philadelphia Inquirer and The Huffington Post.

Joanna Weiss is editor-in-chief of Experience, an award-winning digital magazine published by Northeastern University. She is a contributing editor to Politico Magazine, where she writes frequently about the intersection of politics, media, and culture.

From 2016-2018, Ms. McKnight served as the Migration and Human Rights Chief at U.S. Embassy Mexico City, and before that she was the Political-External Unit Chief at U.S. Embassy Rome.
